
Partner & Sponsorship Portfolio

Safety & Operations Portfolio

We've all heard the adage "it's all fun and games until someone loses an eye." This team is here to help keep things full of fun and games, and to help people keep their eyes.

General Safety

In hopes to best inform the members of the level of experience required for any given event, this team will review newly posted events and let organizers know of any information they may have overlooked in the event description, recommended items to bring, difficulty ratings, terrain ratings, and so on. Together with the event coordinator, the Safety & Operations team work to make the event posting as accurate and informative as possible.

Equipment

Being prepared is one of the most important aspects of staying safe and having fun. The Safety and Operations team is home to whom many refer as "The Gearheads" of society. If you have any questions regarding what type of equipment is best for any given event – or if you are in the market to purchase new equipment, we are here to help you collect information, and will help you make the best decision for your needs. Generally, we will know about most equipment first hand, and if we don't we will do our best to gather the information you may need.

Training

Also as part of doing our best to leave people's eyes where they belong, the Safety and Operations training branch works with external organizations to bring training sessions to volunteers & members. Training sessions are in the works for First Aid, CPR, and wilderness survival certifications.

...being away from the rat race and the daily grind, even if it is just for a few hours.






